This fall marks, for me, the beginning of 22 years living in Canada and 11 years serving at St. Clement's. Providentially, I find myself writing to you on a day with two feasts, significant to both my past and my present: American Thanksgiving and the feast day of our Patron saint, Clement of Rome.

The Prayer after Communion appointed for today reads:

Gracious God,
who healed the wounds of your Church through the ministry of your servant Clement,
keep us in the unity of your Spirit
that our lives may overflow
with the goodly treasure of your peace.
This we ask through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Wounds. Unity. Peace.

Trace your finger over a map and these three words could be your prayer for a world whose present is marked by violence. Trace your finger across the map of your own skin and these words could tell a story of your past wounds and the scars that signify their healing. But the future? None of us has access to that map.

At St. Clement's, our theme for Advent and Christmas is: "What are you waiting for?"

I cannot know what you and your household are waiting for, but I'd venture that the words of your prayer are not so different from mine:

Healed. Ministry. Overflow.

On the feast of our Patron saint, we are reminded that What is but a foretaste compared with Who: Jesus Christ our Lord.

For only Jesus has the power to bind your wounds, bringing healing and peace. The One whose "power, working in us, can do infinitely more than we can ask or imagine." The One who, though we walk through the valley of the shadow of death, prepares for us a feast, anoints our head with oil, and makes our cup overflow.

This season, I invite you to join me and my house in making a special gift to St. Clement's Church.

Amidst rising food insecurity in Toronto, your generosity has touched lives through supporting agencies like **Flemingdon Park** Ministry, Flemingdon Food Bank, St Bartholomew's Food Bank, Flemington Public School's nutrition program, and **Unity Table.** Your contributions have amplified our mission to alleviate hunger and create a community that shares warmth and nourishment.

As we reflect on these impactful initiatives, **your steadfast** support has not only changed lives but also built bridges of compassion, resilience, and hope.



GROWING & LEARNING IN FAITH

Imagine a space where over 50 diverse people gather to engage in deep discussion about life's profound questions – this is **OMG Tuesdays**. Guided by our pastoral team, each session explores the relevance of faith as we navigate the world around us. This past year, we explored the fruits of the Spirit, journeyed with the first disciples through the book of Acts, and dug deep into the richness of Galatians. Together, we pondered how mercy, forgiveness, and reconciliation weave into our everyday lives, a shared exploration that defines our community.

Our inter-generational **Small Groups**, now entering their third year, have become instruments for personal and communal **transformation** – a place to foster trusting relationships with God and one another. Participants describe their experience as a warm, enlightened space for deepening faith and joyful **learning**. There's no formula—just ordinary people, navigating life and learning to follow Jesus together.

As we step into the future, we're excited to welcome this journey of faith and learning to continue to shape who we become as a community over the next decade.
